The present writ petition is directed against the order dated 18.02.2016, passed by the Central Administrative Tribunal, Patna Bench, Patna in Original Application No. 705/2015. By the said order, the Tribunal has rejected the claim of the applicant-writ petitioner to set aside the disciplinary proceedings on grounds of delay and the Tribunal has further ordered that the disciplinary

proceedings should be concluded within six months, failing which, subject to cooperation of petitioner, the proceedings would stand terminated.

After arguing the matter for sometime, Sri Tej Bahadur Singh, learned Senior Counsel appearing for the writ petitioner seeks leave to withdraw the writ petition to participate in the disciplinary proceedings and take such other remedy as may be available to him.

Smt. Nivedita Nirwikar, learned Central Government Counsel has no objection.

Leave is granted.

The writ petition is dismissed as withdrawn.
