The controversy having been raised by the petitioner about certain manipulation in the name of the Madarsa which has walked away with certain advantage including financial aid, these are matter of dispute which can only be decided by a civil court of competent jurisdiction. A summary proceeding under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is not the forum for such dispute.

Writ application is dismissed with liberty to the petitioner to invoke the jurisdiction of a civil court, if he so wants.
