The Petitioners seek quashing of the order dated 30.3.2013 passed by the Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Patna in Maintenance case No.203 of 2011, by which he has directed the Opposite Party No.2 to pay Rs.5000/- to the Petitioner No.1 and Rs.2000/- to the Petitioner No.2 per month from the date of the order and Rs.15,000/- in one lump-sum as litigation cost.

Even though the Petitioners are aggrieved with the ad-interim maintenance, it would be in their interest that the proceeding be concluded at the earliest.

In such circumstances, the Court below is directed to conclude the proceeding positively within a period of four months from the date of receipt of this order without granting unnecessary adjournments to any party.

With the aforesaid directions, the application stands dismissed.
