Heard learned counsels for the petitioner and the State.

The petitioner being the husband of the informant is apprehending arrest in a case registered for the offences punishable under Sections 498A, 323, 341, 504 and 406/34 of the Indian Penal Code and 3/4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act.

The basic accusation is of torture for non-fulfillment of initial dowry demand of tractor and subsequently motorcycle.

It is submitted by the learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner admits his marriage with the informant and is ready to keep her as wife with full dignity and honour, statement to that effect has been made in para 7 of the petition which reads as follows:-

“That the petitioner is ready to live with the informant with full dignity and honour.”

It is submitted by learned counsel for the informant that the informant is ready to accept the offer the petitioner.

Both sides are agree to appear before the learned court below on 27th of September, 2016 when the petitioner will take the informant to keep her as wife with full dignity and honour.

Considering the present stand of the petitioner, let the above named petitioner be released on provisional anticipatory bail for one year in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of twelve weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of ₹10,000/- (ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned CJM, Rohtas at Sasaram in connection with Mahila P.S. Case No. 28 of 2016, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

The provisional bail of the petitioner will be confirmed by the learned court below in three eventualities (i) if the matrimonial harmony is substantially restored (ii) if the informant failed to appear or (iii) if the informant deliberately refuses to reside with the petitioner.
