3. With the consent of learned counsel for the parties, matters are heard finally.
4. Learned counsel for the parties would submit that issue raised in these writ petitions is covered by Writ Appeal No.32 of 2015 (Dinesh Kumar Dewangan and others Vs. State of Chhattisgarh and others) and analogous appeals decided on 09/12/2015, in which, Division Bench of this Court observed as under:-

“9. We therefore consider it necessary to remand these matters to the Secretary, Panchayat and Rural Development Department to pass a reasoned and speaking order in accordance with law, and if the Appellants so request, grant them a representative hearing.

10. Let such appropriate fresh orders be passed within a maximum period of six months from the date of receipt and/or production of a copy of this order. The order under appeal to the extent that it concerns the present Appellants is set aside. The writ appeals are allowed with directions.”

5. In view of the above, these writ petitions are disposed in similar terms as Writ Appeal No.32 of 2015

(Dinesh Kumar Dewangan and others Vs. State of Chhattisgarh and others) and analogous appeals.
