1. Heard learned Counsel appearing for the Petitioner and learned APP for the State. The Petitioner is seeking a direction to the Respondent - police authorities to register an FIR on the basis of the Petitioner's complaint dated 20th May 2015 [Exhibit- C to the petition].

2. Learned APP, on instructions, makes a statement that the Petitioner's said complaint was duly enquired into. The enquiry did not disclose the commission of cognizable offence and therefore NC case is registered. Statement is accepted.

3. In the backdrop of the statements made by the learned APP, we find that the Petitioner has an alternate and efficacious remedy. He can file a private complaint before the Magistrate, if so advised. We see no reason to entertain the writ petition and the same is therefore dismissed.
