1. The learned counsel for the State submits that pursuant to the directions given by this Court by its order dated 4th April, 2016, he has taken instructions

from the concerned authorities. He submits that the State Government shall process the claim of the Petitioner within six weeks from today.

2. We, therefore, direct the State Government to process the claim of the Petitioner as expeditiously as possible and, in any case, within a period of six weeks from today and after the claim is processed and approved, they shall prepare budgetary provision immediately. It is also clarified that after the budgetary provision is made, the amount is transferred to KIDC, who shall promptly make the payment to the Petitioner. With these directions the writ petitions are disposed of. Civil applications filed in the writ petitions do not survive and are accordingly disposed of. Liberty is granted to apply.
