By the present application, the Applicant is seeking an appointment of the Court Receiver on the suit property and to direct Defendant No.1 to pay $\frac{1}{4}$ share in the income till date and every month. The order sought for cannot be lightly granted as the appointment of the Court Receiver on the suit property is not a matter of routine course. On 15 July 2016, learned counsel for the parties had sought time to take instructions whether the Applicant has received $\frac{1}{4}$ share in the suit property, as directed. Learned counsel for the Applicant states that, $\frac{1}{4}$ share has been received. The Applicant has received $\frac{1}{4}$ share in the suit property as directed.

Therefore no case is made out for appointment of the Court Receiver on this ground in this application as the appeal is yet to be decided on merits.
