2 The learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that they have no objections if the Court Receiver's Report is made absolute in terms of prayer clauses (a) and (b).

3 The learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that they are ready and willing to deposit cost in the office of the Court Receiver within four weeks from today. Statement is accepted.

4 Considering the submissions made by the learned Counsel for the petitioner and after perusing the report, the following order is passed.

a) Court Receiver's Report is made absolute in terms of prayer clauses (a) & (b), which read thus:

“a) Court Receiver be discharged without passing accounts and Petitioner may be directed to pay cost, charges and expenses of the Court Receiver to the tune of Rs.5,244/-

b) That the cost of an incidental to this report fixed at Rs.3000/- and the Petitioner may be directed to deposit the same in the office of the Court Receiver.”

b) Petitioner to pay cost and charges of the Court Receiver within four weeks from today.

c) If payment is not paid within stipulated time as stated herein above, Court Receiver is directed to place the matter on board for further directions.

d) Court Receiver's Report stands disposed of accordingly.
