1. Accepted. All other heirs having consented, a proclamation is dispensed with. The Petition is made returnable forthwith and taken up for hearing and final disposal.

2. The Petitioner seeks a Legal Heirship Certificate under Section 2 of Bombay Regulation VIII of 1827 in respect of one Gautam B. Rajput Alias Gautam Bhikaji Rajput, who is said to have died intestate in Mumbai, where he was ordinarily resident, on 9th August 2007. A copy of his death certificate is annexed.
