1. There were three Caveators. The 3rd Caveator is personally present in Court today. His name is Mr. Jayant Dwarkadas Sanghvi. He tenders a sworn Affidavit, dated 21st June 2016, withdrawing his Caveat. That Affidavit is taken on record.
2. The 1st and 2nd Caveators, Kiron D. Sanghvi and Balkishan D. Sanghvi, have also withdrawn their Caveats on 15th April 2015 and 4th August 2011 respectively.
