

Crl.O.P.No.14939 of 2016

Apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 379 of IPC in Crime No.223 of 2016 on the file of the respondent police, the petitioner has come forward with this petition seeking anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that A1 is a driver of the lorry. He was arrested and remanded. A2 is a owner of the yard where the sand is sold illegally. A3, one Hari is the person who had given sand load to the driver and the case of the petitioner is that he is the owner of the container lorry, which has been seized.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is unaware of the illegal sand transportation and he is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) submitted that the petitioner has no previous case.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the quantity of theft of sand involved in this case, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of **fifteen (15) days** from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, **before the Judicial Magistrate, Paramathi, Namakkal District**, on condition that the petitioner executes a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

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[a] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation;

[b] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law, as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the

Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.
