Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondents to disburse the payments relating to Gratuity, Commutation, Leave Encashment (Earned Leave and Old Medical Leave), 2013, Settlement Effect Arrears and D.A. Arrears by calculating D.A. eligible as per newly implemented, with interest at 12% per annum with effect from

01.06.2014 within the stipulated time as may be fixed by this Honourable Court.

O R D E R

By consent, the writ petition is taken up for final disposal.

2.The present writ petition has been filed seeking a Mandamus directing the respondents to disburse the payments relating to Gratuity, Commutation, Leave Encashment (Earned Leave and Old Medical Leave), 2013, Settlement Effect Arrears and D.A. Arrears by calculating D.A. eligible as per newly implemented, with interest at 12% per annum with effect from 01.06.2014 within the stipulated time as may be fixed by this Court.

3.It is the case of the petitioner that he joined in the respondent Tamilnadu State Transport Corporation (Villupuram) Limited on 12.02.1986 and conformed on 14.12.1986 and retired from service on 31.05.2014 as Special Grade Conductor. The petitioner was not paid the retirement benefits like Gratuity, Commutation, Leave Encashment (Earned Leave and Old Medical Leave), 2013, Settlement Effect Arrears and D.A. Arrears. Hence, the

petitioner made a representation

dated 23.08.2016 to the second respondent requesting to pay all the retirement benefits. But, the same was not considered so far. Hence, left with no other alternative, the petitioner has come up with the present writ petition for the relief set out earlier.

4.I have heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned counsel who takes notice for the respondents.

5.The issue involved in the present writ petition is squarely covered by the judgment of the Division Bench of the Madurai Bench of this Court dated 12.6.2015 made in W.A.(MD) Nos.383 to 457 of 2015 (K.Rajendran & Others vs. The Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation (Madurai) Limited, rep. by its Managing Director, Madurai and others).

6.Following the said judgment, without going into the merits of the matter, the respondent is directed to disburse the aforementioned retiral benefits to the petitioner herein, in twelve equal monthly instalments, in the light of the common judgment passed by this Court

in **W.A.(MD) Nos.383 to 457 of 2015 (K.Rajendran & Others vs. The Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation (Madurai) Limited, rep. by its Managing Director, Madurai and others), dated**

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12.06.2015. It is also made clear that the first instalment shall commence from 1.12.2016.

7.With the above direction, the present writ petition is disposed of. No costs.
