Prayer:

Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondents to settle payment of Gratuity, Earned Leave, Employees Retirement Benefit Scheme (ERBS), Institute of Road and Transport Technology (IRTT) Fund and other retiral benefits payable to the petitioner with reasonable rate of interest within the time frame that may be stipulated by this Hon'ble Court.

O R D E R

By consent, the writ petition is taken up for final disposal.

2.The present writ petition has been filed seeking a Mandamus directing the respondents to settle payment of Gratuity, Earned Leave, Employees Retirement Benefit Scheme

(ERBS), Institute of Road and Transport Technology (IRTT) Fund and other retiral benefits payable to the petitioner with reasonable rate of interest within the time frame that may be stipulated by this Court.

3.It is the case of the petitioner that he joined in the respondent Corporation on 01.01.1980 and retired from service on 02.06.2012 under the Voluntary Retirement Scheme as Selection Grade Senior Conductor. The petitioner was not paid the retirement benefits like Gratuity, Earned Leave, Employees Retirement Benefit Scheme (ERBS), Institute of Road and Transport Technology (IRTT) Fund etc. Hence, the petitioner made a representation dated 20.08.2016 to the respondent requesting to pay all the retirement benefits. But, the same was not considered so far. Hence, left with no other alternative, the petitioner has come up with the present writ petition for the relief set out earlier.

4.I have heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned counsel who takes notice for the respondents.

5.The issue involved in the present writ petition is squarely covered by the judgment of the Division Bench of the Madurai Bench of this Court dated 12.6.2015 made in W.A.(MD) Nos.383 to 457 of 2015 (K.Rajendran & Others vs. The Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation (Madurai) Limited, rep. by its Managing Director, Madurai and others).

6.Following the said judgment, without going into the merits of the matter, the respondent is directed to disburse the aforementioned retiral benefits to the petitioner herein, in twelve equal monthly instalments, in the light of the common judgment passed by this Court in W.A.(MD) Nos.383 to 457 of 2015 (K.Rajendran & Others vs. The Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation (Madurai) Limited, rep. by its Managing Director, Madurai and others), dated 12.06.2015. It is also made clear that the first instalment shall commence from 1.12.2016. With the above direction, the present writ petition is disposed of. No costs.
