Prayer in W.P.No.39289 of 2016:

Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondent to settle the terminal benefits of the petitioner of gratuity amount of Rs.8,50,000/-, Surrender of earned leave 28.5 days amount of Rs.39,900/-, Social Security Scheme amount of Rs.30,000/- and Erode Engineering College and Perundurai Medical College refund amount of Rs.4,500/- altogether a sum of Rs.9,24,400/- with interest at the rate of 6% per annum taking into consideration of the representation of the petitioner dated 21.10.2016.

Prayer in W.P.No.39290 of 2016:

Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondent to settle the terminal benefits of the petitioner of gratuity amount of Rs.5,75,000/-, Surrender of earned leave 182 days and medical leave 84.5 days amount of Rs.2,94,000/-, Social Security Scheme amount of Rs.30,000/- and Erode Engineering College and Perundurai Medical College refund amount of Rs.4,500/- altogether a sum of Rs.9,03,500/- with interest at the rate of 6% per annum taking into consideration of the representation of the petitioner dated 31.10.2016.

C O M M O N O R D E R

By consent, the writ petitions are taken up for final disposal. Since the issue involved in all these petitions are related to each other, they are disposed of by a common order.

2.The writ petitions have been filed seeking Mandamus directing the respondents to settle the retirement benefits, due to the petitioners, together with interest.

3.The petitioners are the employees of the respondent Corporation and they were not paid the retirement benefits due to them, fully. Hence, the petitioners made representation to the respondent requesting to pay all the retirement benefits. But, the same have not been considered so far. Hence, left with no other alternative, the petitioners have come up with the present writ petitions for the relief set out earlier.

4.I have heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the learned counsel who take notice for the respondents.

5.The issue involved in the present writ petitions is squarely covered by the judgment of the Division Bench of the Madurai Bench of this Court dated 12.6.2015 made in W.A.(MD) Nos.383 to 457 of 2015 (K.Rajendran & Others vs. The Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation (Madurai) Limited, rep. by its Managing Director, Madurai and others).

6.Following the said judgment, without going into the merits of the matter, the respondent is directed to disburse the aforementioned retiral benefits to the petitioners herein, in twelve equal monthly instalments, in the light of the common judgment passed by this Court in W.A.(MD) Nos.383 to 457 of 2015 (K.Rajendran & Others vs. The Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation (Madurai) Limited, rep. by its Managing Director, Madurai and others), dated 12.06.2015. It is also made clear that the first instalment shall commence from 01.02.2017.

7.With the above direction, the present writ petitions are disposed of. No costs.

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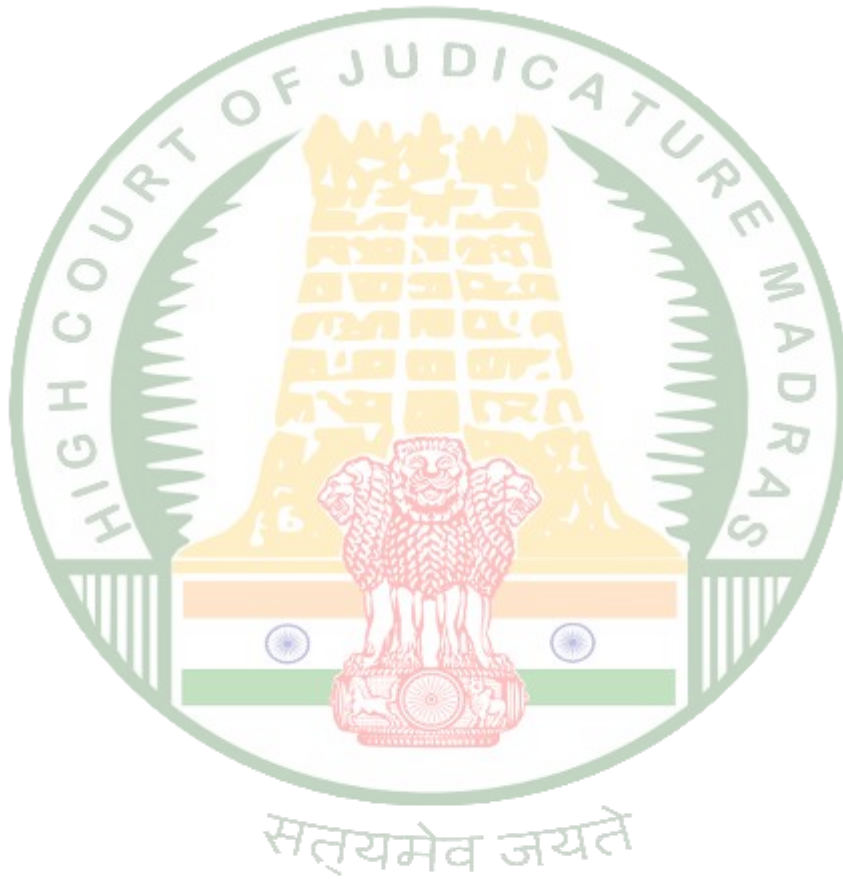
