PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec. 439 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 08.01.2016, for the offences punishable under Sections 120(b), 406 and 420 I.P.C., in Crime No.4 of 2016, on the file of the respondent Police, seeks bail.

2. Heard Mr.R.Sevugaraja, learned counsel appearing for the petitioner /1st Accused and Mr.A.P.Balasubramani, learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the State.

3. On reading of the complaint, it appears that the de facto complainant was working under the petitioner / 1st Accused herein and thereafter he lodged the present complaint stating that the petitioner / 1st Accused had cheated him. The petitioner / 1st Accused in incarceration from 08.01.2016.

4. Taking into consideration the nature of allegations made against the petitioner / 1st Accused and the fact that except the present complaint, there is no other complaint against him, this Court is of the view that this is a fit case to grant bail to the petitioner / 1st Accused. Accordingly, he is ordered to be released on bail, subject to the following conditions:

- (i) the petitioner / 1st Accused shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.IV, Tiruchirappalli.
