



2. We have heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing on behalf of the State. We have also perused the records carefully.

3. Though it is stated by the learned counsel for the petitioner that the detenu is mentally ill, there is no averment found in the affidavit to that effect.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit that the detenu is happily residing with the third respondent for the past three years. This shows that there is no illegal detention. The Habeas Corpus Petition is, therefore, dismissed.
