Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying for the issuance of a Writ of Mandamus directing the Respondents to pay terminal benefits of the petitioner's husband Late S.D.C.Prabaharan to her including gratuity, earned Leave Salary, Refund of Contribution made towards Medical, Engineering Polytechnic Colleges and Institute of Road Transport together with interest at the rate of 18% per annum payable from the date of retirement to till the date on which the above benefits are settled to the petitioner.

So pleads the petitioner, praying for disbursement of retirement benefits.

The petitioner's husband was employed as Senior Driver in the respondent corporation and he passed away on 04.06.2015, while in service.



2.The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking for a direction to the respondents to pay the terminal benefits of her husband.

3.The First Bench of this Court in similar matter has passed an order dated 12.06.2015 in W.A(MD)Nos.383 to 457 of 2015, issuing direction to the transport corporations to settle the terminal benefits of its employees in 12 equal monthly installments and to pay 6% interest on the terminal benefits payable to the workman. The Bench has also held that workman is entitled to 18% interest for the defaulted period of installments.

4.In these circumstances, the writ petition is disposed of with the following directions:-

(i)A direction is issued to the transport corporation to settle the terminal benefits of the petitioner that are yet to be settled, in twelve equal monthly installments.

(ii)The first installment shall commence by making payment on or before 1st week of January, 2017 and the amount in each of the remaining installments shall be paid on or before 10th of every succeeding month.

(iii)The said terminal amount shall carry interest @ 6% per annum as per the Division Bench judgment referred to above. In case of delay in making installments, the interest payable could be 18% for the delayed period.

5.The aforesaid direction to settle the terminal benefits would not preclude the workman to question the computation of any of the terminal benefits, if the same is paid lesser than the amount to which, he is entitled to receive. Likewise, if the petitioner has any grievance that he is entitled to interest for the amount already settled, he can agitate the same as per law, if he is entitled. No costs.
