Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of a Writ of Mandamus declaring the final-key answer to the Questions No.21, 52, 69, 117 and 138 of the Question paper (Type B) for the Written Examination for recruitment to the post of Sub-Inspector of Police-2015 published by the Respondent No.3 as wrong and erroneous and consequently to direct the Respondents to select the petitioner (Enrollment No.5400102) as the Sub Inspect of Police by awarding marks to the petitioner for the above said questions.

ORDER

The petitioner has come to this Court without even mentioning in the affidavit filed in support of this writ petition that what is wrong answer which was given in the key answers and filed this writ petition bereft of material particulars. Therefore, such kind of writ petition cannot be entertained.

2.In similar matter, the First Bench of this Court by order dated 07/03.2016 in W.P.No.8391 of 2016 imposed a sum of Rs.2,500/- (Rupees Two Thousand and Five Hundred Only) and held as follows:



"5.We had cautioned the learned counsel that now number of cases are coming up to somehow get into the list. This is a complete waste of judicial time and adventurism at best, especially when we have laid down principles which we examined in these matters. We thus, feel that the petitioner must be burdened with costs. However, taking into consideration the economic status of the petitioner, we impose only limited costs.

6.The writ petition is dismissed with costs of Rs.2,500/- (Rupees Two Thousand and Five Hundred Only) to be deposited with the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, High Court, Campus, Madras within a period of 15 days. Consequently, W.M.P.No.7432 of 2016 is closed".

3.Following the same, this writ petition dismissed with a cost of Rs.2,500/- (Rupees Two Thousand and Five Hundred Only) to be deposited with the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, attached to this Bench within a period of 15 days.
