The order dated 12.5.2014, non-compliance of which is alleged by the petitioner mandated the respondent no.1 in the writ petition to reconsider the matter regarding issuance of temporary permit, in view of directions issued by the Appellate Tribunal by hearing the parties concerned and pass a fresh order in accordance with law within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the certified copy of the order.

Reply indicates that needful has since been done and a speaking order passed.

In view of above, when orders of the writ Court stands complied with, instant petition has been rendered infructuous and the same is disposed of as such, with liberty to the petitioner to challenge the order so passed in case it is dis-satisfied with the same. Rule against the respondents is discharged.
