While deciding the writ petition of the Punjab and Sind Bank, the Division Bench of this Court, vide its order dated 22.12.2014, directed the District Magistrate/the Additional District Magistrate to issue an order of possession with the help of police forthwith, but subject to the condition that petitioner would file a duly executed and attested affidavit before the District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate.

After notice, reply has been filed by way of an affidavit of Punamdeep Kaur P.C.S, Additional District Magistrate, S.A.S.Nagar, wherein she has averred that the order passed by this Court has been complied with as possession of 06 B – 12 B of land has been delivered to the secured creditor i.e. Punjab and Sind Bank. The details of the assets handed over to secured creditors has also been given in paragraph No. 4 of the affidavit besides the detail of the assets which could not be handed over

because stay has been granted in CWP No. 20926 of 2015 on 30.09.2015, directing the parties to maintain status quo.

In view thereof, the order passed by this Court, which could have been complied with, has been duly complied with and thus, the present petition has become infructuous.

Dismissed as infructuous.
