AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (Oral):

Short reply by way of affidavit of Shri J.R. Mehrook, Secretary, Punjab School Education Board, has been filed in Court, which is taken on record, copy whereof supplied to the counsel for the petitioners.

Counsel for the respondents submits that a speaking order has been passed, according to which, the petitioners have been granted the consequential benefits as well.

Counsel for the petitioners submits that no interest has been paid to the petitioners which they are also entitled to. He prays for liberty for the petitioners to file a detailed representation claiming therein the interest and any other benefit which the petitioners are entitled to and have not been granted to them, which may be directed to be considered and decided within some specified time.

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In view of the above, let the petitioners make a representation to the Secretary, Punjab School Education Board, within a period of three weeks from today. If such a representation is made, the same shall be considered and decided by passing a speaking order within a period of six weeks from the date of submission of such representation. On decision on the representation, in case, the claim of the petitioner(s) is accepted, the consequential benefits be released to him/them within a further period of four weeks.

The contempt petition stands disposed of with above observation/directions.

Rule issued to the respondents stands discharged, subject to above.
