It is an admitted position that so far as principle amount is concerned, that has been paid by the Management.

Counsel for the respondents further states that the interest has also been paid to the petitioners from the date of retirement, whereas the petitioners assert that the calculations which have been made, are not as per their entitlement.

If that be so, petitioners are at liberty to file a representation to the respondents within a period of three weeks from today. If such representation is made, the same shall be considered and decided by the Management of the College within a period of six weeks. In case the claim

of the petitioner(s) is accepted, the consequential benefits be released to him/them within a further period of four weeks.

With above observations, the present contempt petition is disposed of.
