Learned counsel for the State, while referring to the affidavit dated 29.7.2016 of the Principal of the Government in Service Training Centre, Patiala, has submitted that the interest on delayed payment in respect of arrears of stepped up pay has been calculated and paid to the petitioner vide Cheque No.792990 dated 24.12.2014, therefore, the order passed by this Court has been duly complied with.

However, learned counsel for the petitioner has referred to an affidavit dated 19.08.2015 in which the petitioner has claimed interest of ₹44708/- on the following payments: -

“i) Pension ₹1,47,380/- paid on 02.03.2015

ii) Pension ₹41,103/- paid on 02.04.2015

iii) DCRG ₹13,195/- paid on 13.03.2015

iv) DCRG ₹7,297/- paid on 25.04.2015”

Be that as it may, insofar as the present petition is concerned, the same has become infructuous. However, the petitioner is given liberty to file a representation to the respondents in respect of the amount of interest, which has now been claimed in the affidavit dated 19.8.2015. In case, any such representation is made by the petitioner, within one month from the date of this order, to the concerned authority of the respondents, the same shall be decided by the respondents, by passing a speaking order, within two months from the date of filing of the representation.

Dismissed as infructuous.
