AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J (ORAL)

In the present contempt petition, the petitioner has asserted that an order dated 28.05.2015 (Annexure P-1) was passed by this Court, whereby it was observed by this Court that Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran (respondent No. 3 in the writ petition) was to be obligated to visulaize the facts and in case the grievance of the petitioner is found to be worth consideration, then pass appropriate orders in accordance with law. He contends that after having conveyed the order, no action has been taken by the respondent. Even a communication dated 30.05.2016 (Annexure P-3) sent by the petitioner has not yielded any result as the respondent, who is a Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran, has not passed any orders on the representation/legal notice of the petitioner with regard to his grievance.

This contention, as has been projected in the contempt petition, would not be contemptuous of the order dated 28.05.2015. Which is observed in the order is only to obligate to visulaize the facts and in case the grievance of the petitioner is found to be worth consideration, then only an

order has to be passed otherwise, the order is required or mandated to be passed by the Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran.

In the light of the above, the present petition is devoid of merit and, therefore, the same stands dismissed.
