Short reply by way of affidavit of Shri R.L.Garg, Deputy Chief Engineer (Personnel), Punjab State Power Corporation Ltd., Patiala-respondent No.3, has been filed in Court, which is taken on record, according to which, an office order dated 02.08.2016 (Annexure R-1) has been passed in compliance with the order passed by this Court.

Counsel for the petitioners states that the present contempt petition has been rendered infructuous.

Prayer in CM No.15130-CII of 2016 is for impleading the applicants as respondents No.4 to 7 to the contempt petition on the assertion that the correct facts have not been brought to the notice of the Court which would have bearing with regard to the implementation of the orders as have been passed by this Court from time to time in the contempt petition.

Having heard the counsel for the applicants and keeping in view the fact that the applicants' writ petition i.e. CWP No.16630 of 2014, titled as 'Darshan Singh & others Vs. Punjab State Power Corporation Ltd. & others', is pending before a Single Judge, this Court is of the opinion that they are not required to be impleaded as parties in the present contempt petition especially in the light of the fact that the matter is pending before a Coordinate Bench. Further, this Court has not opined anything upon the claims/counter-claims of any of the parties and has only insisted upon the

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compliance of the orders passed by this Court.

In view of the above, no order is required to be passed in CM No.15131-CII of 2016.

The present contempt petition as also the miscellaneous applications are disposed of as infructuous.

Rule issued to the respondents stands discharged.
