MAHESH GROVER, J.

The order of the writ Court mandated as follows:-

“Under the circumstances, we dispose of both the writ petitions by directing respondents – Punjab State Power Corporation and the State of Punjab to release family pension and other benefits due to the petitioner within a period of two months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order, failing which she will be entitled to simple interest at the rate of 9% per annum till such amount is not paid.”

The respondents have filed a reply indicating compliance which was seriously controverted by the petitioner who filed a counter affidavit detailing the

Respondents have now filed a status report by way of affidavit of Er. Sarabjit Singh, Addl. Supdt. Engineer, Punjab State Power Corporation Ltd., Hoshiarpur wherein all the details of the payments made to the petitioner have been given in a tabulated form (Annexure R-1).

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that there is a shortfall in gratuity which has also been explained by the respondents in para 2 of their status report filed today.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties, I am of the considered opinion that there is sufficient compliance of the orders of the writ Court. Therefore rule against the respondents is discharged, leaving the petitioner to his remedies in law, in the event of any shortfalls.
