Counsel for the applicant-respondent states that the present
application has been rendered infructuous. Disposed of as such.

C.O.C.P. No.3007 of 2014

As per order dated 26.10.2016 passed by this Court, counsel for
the respondent has handed over an amount of ₹20,000/- in cash to
petitioner, Suresh Chand, who is present in Court.
