AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (Oral):

Counsel for respondent No.2 states that the amount has been credited to the petitioners by way of transfer in the account of the petitioners. He states that in the light of the above, the order passed by the trial Court, contempt of which has been alleged, stands duly complied with.

Counsel for the petitioners states that he would have to verify the said fact but keeping in view the statement of the counsel for respondent No.2 which is based upon the affidavit which has been filed by respondent No.2, this Court is of the considered view that it appears that the order passed by the trial Court has been duly complied with and therefore, the contempt petition does not survive.

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The present contempt petition is, therefore, disposed of as infructuous with liberty to the petitioner to revive the same in case the assertions made in the affidavit are found to be incorrect.

Rule issued against the respondents stands discharged.
