AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)

It is the contention of learned counsel for the petitioners that the respondents have fixed a date for giving effect to the resolutions, which have been passed by the Board from 05.06.2013 to 02.07.2013. He contends that the consequential benefits have to be given from the said date.

This contention of learned counsel for the petitioners cannot be accepted in the light of the order dated 07.07.2015, passed by this Court, according to which the respondents were to take a decision with regard to the implementation of the resolutions referred to by the petitioner within a period of three months from the date of receipt of copy of the order.

That means that the decision had to be taken by the respondents, firstly, with regard to the implementation of the resolution and secondly, with regard to the date from which it would be given effect to.

The decision had been taken to give effect to the resolution to the Boards w.e.f. 16.05.2016. The decision, as taken, being in consonance with the order passed by this Court, no contempt is made out.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition stands disposed of with liberty to the petitioners to avail of the remedy in accordance with law, if aggrieved.

Rule issued to the respondents stands discharged.
