MAHESH GROVER, J.

The order of the writ Court mandated release of retiral dues to the petitioner and also number of other similarly situated persons.

In para 3 of the reply filed on behalf of the respondents, details of the payments made to the petitioner have been given. In para 4 it has been stated that the amount on account of revised pay scales amounting to Rs. 33,142/- shall be paid to the petitioner as per his seniority.

Petitioner has not filed any counter affidavit to refute this stand of the respondents.

Evidently, he admits that Rs. 33,142/- is the only amount due.

Respondents have not denied the payment but have stated that it shall be paid as per seniority.

If that be so, then I am of the opinion that there is sufficient compliance of the orders of the writ Court and therefore, instant petition has been rendered infructuous and the same is disposed of as such, leaving the petitioner to his remedies in law. Rule against the respondents is discharged.

The respondents shall be bound to the affidavit filed in Court to release the remaining payment to the petitioner as per his seniority.
