**AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)**

This revision has been filed against the eviction of the petitioner.

After arguing for some time learned counsel for the petitioner states that he would not press this petition on merits in case three months time is granted to the petitioner to vacate the premises.

Learned counsel for the respondent has accepted this offer but put the following stipulations :-

(i)that the petitioner will voluntarily vacate the premises on or before 31.05.2016 without forcing the landlord to take

possession through the executing Court and will file an undertaking to this effect before the executing Court within 15 days.

(ii)that he will pay up-to-date rent upto 31.05.2016 within 15 days alongwith arrears and will continue to pay other applicable charges regularly.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has accepted these conditions.

Petition is disposed of in the above terms.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending civil miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
