Counsel for the petitioner has circulated an adjournment slip and the petitioner is not present in the Court.

On 16.09.2015, notice of motion was issued and parties were directed to be present in the Court on the next date of hearing. After that the respondent was served in the case and Ms. Bhupinder Pal Kaur, Advocate has caused appearance on behalf of the respondent. As per order dated 08.02.2016, it was directed that the parties shall remain present in the Court on the next date of hearing. The parties came present in the Court on 01.04.2016 and the order passed on that day reads as follows:-

“Parties are present in Court.

A talk regarding exploring possibility of an amicable settlement has been initiated and there appears to be possibility of a settlement.

Counsel for the petitioner prays for some time to ensure presence of father of the petitioner before the Court so that the parties can deliberate in details in the

direction of settlement.

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List on 25.04.2016.

The petitioner is directed to pay an amount of Rs.1,000,00/- to the respondent-wife in regard to her expenses for appearance in the Court.”

On the adjourned date, i.e. 25.04.2016, the petitioner was not present in the Court but on request made by counsel for the petitioner, the case was adjourned for today with a direction to the petitioner to pay an amount of Rs.2,000/- to the respondent in regard to her expenses for appearance in the Court on 25.04.2016.

Today the petitioner is again not present in the Court and the amount of Rs.2,000/- as directed on 25.04.2016 has not been paid. Keeping in view the conduct of the petitioner of his failure to appear in the Court and to comply with the direction of the Court to pay an amount of Rs.2,000/- to the respondent in regard to her expenses for appearance, the petition is order to be dismissed.
