Present writ petition was filed with the following prayers: -

“It is therefore respectfully prayed that a writ, order or direction be issued to the respondent to allow the petitioner to operate its Current Account No.220 and withdraw, deposit or any manner deal with the money deposited in the account by the petitioner including issuing of cheque etc. in accordance with the Banking Regulations.

ii. any other writ or direction which this Hon'ble Court may deem fit in facts and circumstances be issued.

iii. that pending the decision of the writ petition the petitioner may be allowed to operate his bank account No.220 with respondent Bank.”

Notice of motion was issued by a Division Bench of this Court vide

order dated 12.08.1998 without any interim order. The writ petition was admitted vide order dated 11.08.1999 passed by a Division Bench of this Court and the same reads as under: -

“Heard learned counsel for the parties.

Admit.

There shall be no stay of any kind in favour of the petitioner and the proceedings pending in this and other Courts shall not be adversely affected by the pendency of this petition. It is also made clear that the petitioner shall not be entitled to operate current Bank Account No.220 which it has opened with the respondent-Bank.”

In view of the abovesaid order passed by a Division Bench of this Court, coupled with the fact that a time of more than 18 years has lapsed, nothing survives in the present writ petition to be decided, at the hands of this Court.

In view of the abovesaid undisputed fact situation obtaining on the record, present writ petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous.
