Amrinder Singh/petitioner No.1 is the husband of Harjinder Kaur/respondent No.7, whereas petitioner Nos.2 to 4 are brothers and petitioner Nos.5 & 6 are parents of petitioner No.1. Petitioner No.11- Amrinder Kaur is the sister and the remaining petitioners are spouses of brothers and sisters of petitioner No.1. All of them have prayed for blanket bail on the ground that Harjinder Kaur/respondent No.7 (wife of petitioner No.1) was found missing and has finally left her matrimonial home and the minor child. She being greedy and characterless lady wants to grab the property of the petitioners.

According to the petitioners, the police has summoned them and informed that a complaint has been received regarding allegations of demand of dowry.

It is submitted that neither the FIR has been lodged against the petitioners nor any copy of the complaint has been supplied. Hence, the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. read with Section 438 Cr.P.C.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner heard at length.

Once there is a specific complaint as pleaded, there is no reason for this Court to extend the benefit of blanket bail as the petitioners can avail their remedy in accordance with law by attaching the copy of the complaint or the FIR before learned Magistrate vested with the jurisdiction.

In view of the above, the present petition stands dismissed.
