Petitioner seeks quashing of FIR No. 202 dated 03.12.2015 on the basis of compromise having been arrived at between the parties.

With the assistance of learned counsel for the parties, I have gone through the record which indicates that when respondent No. 2 Gurpreet Singh was present in the house of Sukhdev Singh, three unknown persons came in the car and the petitioner assaulted the complainant with baseball bat and threatened on pistol point to take away Rs. 50,000/- from the house of Sukhdev Singh. The role attributed to the petitioner is that he gave a baseball bat blow on the left side of the hip of the complainant and pointed pistol towards Sukhdev Singh and extended threat.

Without expression of any opinion on merits, it is sufficient to observe by this Court that parties have got their statements recorded. As per the report received, the matter has been amicably settled and the compromise would be for the welfare of both the parties.

Statement of the injured and the complainant have been recorded.

In view of the Full Bench judgment of this Court in *“Kulwinder Singh vs. State of Punjab, 2007 (3) Recent Criminal Reports (P&H), 1052”*, I am of the opinion that on account of the matter having been amicably resolved between the parties, neither any useful purpose will be served nor any fruitful result by trial would be achieved.

The petition is allowed. The aforesaid FIR No. 202 dated 03.12.2015 and all the consequent proceedings emanating therefrom are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise.
