JASPAL SINGH, J. (ORAL)

This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No. 10 dated 14.01.2010 under Sections 452, 324, 506 and 34 IPC registered at Police Station Payal, Ludhiana and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise (Annexure P-2)

2 Report of learned trial Court has been received, wherein, it has been categorically observed that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily,

without any pressure, threat or coercion. Even otherwise, matter involved in these proceedings is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in cases reported as ***Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another***; 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and ***Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another (2014) 6 SCC 466***, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No. 10 dated 14.01.2010 under Sections 452, 324, 506 and 34 IPC registered at Police Station Payal, Ludhiana and all subsequent proceedings arising out of the same are quashed qua petitioners.
