Petitioner has filed this petition for quashing of FIR No.391 dated 29.7.2013 registered under Sections 452, 427, 504, 294, 506, 448, 511 of IPC at Police Station Baldev Nagar, District Ambala (Annexure P1) on the ground that parties have entered into compromise.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have also carefully gone through the file.

It comes out that the dispute is between brothers. Petitioner No.1 is brother of the complainant. It was alleged in the FIR by Raj Kumar complainant that the present petitioner in order to take forcible possession of the room in possession of the complainant

threw away his domestic articles and tried to take forcible possession of the room. The petitioner has produced on file the compromise (Annexure P2), vide which, a family settlement had taken place between all the brothers and sisters and joint property has been divided. It has been agreed that all the civil and criminal cases pending before the Court shall be withdrawn or favourable statement shall be made.

Counsel for the complainant present in Court has stated that he has no objection if the FIR is quashed.

Keeping in view the fact that it was a property dispute between the brothers and now the matter has been amicably settled, the petition is allowed. FIR No.391 dated 29.7.2013 registered under Sections 452, 427, 504, 294, 506, 448, 511 of IPC at Police Station Baldev Nagar, District Ambala (Annexure P1) along with all the consequential proceedings is quashed.
