JASWANT SINGH, J.(ORAL)

Prayer is under Section 439 Cr.PC for grant of regular bail to the petitioners, namely, Monu Singh @ Sandeep Singh in case FIR No.05 dated 30.01.2016 for offences punishable under Sections 307, 353, 183, 332, 341, 148, 149 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code registered with Police Station Jhunir, District Mansa.

The allegations levelled against the petitioner, as per the supplementary statement was that he being a part of the mob of 60/70 people which was, *inter alia*, led by the co-accused-Jaspreet Singh @ Bali which attacked the police party as the police was trying to make them understand in relation of one accident between a motor cycle and

vehicle of a liquor contractor. Two of the co-accused Kulwinder Singh and Amrit Pal have also inflicted blows on the head and chest of the complainant apart from the dress of the constable Rajinder Singh having been torn off. The SHO was also pushed to the ground, whereby his turban was also unseated.

It is contended that no overt act has been attributed to the petitioner. The petitioner is stated to be in custody since 31.01.2016 and the investigation qua him is over.

It is next contended that the aforesaid co-accused Amrit Pal who is attributed a *soti* blow on the chest of the complainant has since been enlarged on bail vide order dated 04.04.2016.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Darshan Singh, does not refute the aforesaid factual situation and the said Amrit Pal has been granted regular bail.

Without commenting on the merits of the case, keeping in view the custody period and parity of treatment, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate / Duty Magistrate concerned.

Disposed of.
