Present 2nd petition is for grant of regular bail under Section 439 Cr.P.C. on behalf of the petitioner/accused-Seema Tarar in case FIR No.136 dated 12.08.2008, under Sections 406, 420, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, registered with Police Station Phase 8, SAS Nagar, Mohali, Punjab.

The allegations of the complainant-Raj Kumar are that the present petitioner/accused-Seema Tarar along with her co-accused husband Abhimanyu Sharma and another co-accused Khushwinder Singh had induced him to pay a sum of Rs.5 Lacs on the pretext of selling a flat.

The petitioner is stated to have been arrested and then enlarged on bail wayback in the year 2009. On 09.01.2012, a compromise (**Annexure P-3**) is stated to have been effected, leading to the mistake of the petitioner not appearing on one of the dates, resultantly she was declared as proclaimed offender on 10.07.2015. She was re-arrested on 16.01.2016.

It is contended that a sum of Rs.2 Lacs was earlier paid and the petitioner and rest of the co-accused are now ready and willing to pay another sum of Rs.5 Lacs to the complainant so as to finally settle the entire dispute.

Learned Counsel for the complainant has accepted the proposal.

Learned State Counsel, assisted by ASI Paramjeet Singh, in the light of the stand of the complainant, has nothing substantial to oppose the grant of bail.

Without commenting on the merits of the case and keeping in view of the aforesaid development, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to deposit of Rs.5 lacs before the trial Court for disbursement to the complainant towards final settlement, and on its satisfaction.
