A.B. Chaudhari, J. (Oral):

Heard learned Counsel for the rival parties. In FIR No.21 dated 6.4.2014, registered at Police Station Jhander, District, Amritsar the petitioners are being prosecuted for the offences under Sections 452, 506, 148, 149 IPC. During the pendency of the prosecution, the parties have arrived at a compromise, namely, the complainant and the petitioners, accused persons.

This Court had made an order on 1.4.2016 directing the parties to appear before the trial court for recording of their statements so as to find out the genuineness of the compromise. Accordingly, statements of the parties have been recorded by the SDJM, Ajnala and the report is sent by him along with the statements. It is clear therefrom that the compromise between the petitioners and the complainant is genuine and without any threat, coercion or undue influence. To enable the parties to live in peace

and harmony, this Court deems it appropriate that the petition deserves to be allowed. The petition is accordingly allowed. FIR in question along with all consequential proceedings is quashed and set aside by way of compounding/compromise.
