For having been found in possession of 100 grams of intoxicating powder containing Diphenoxylate Hydrochloride, the petitioner was arrested on June 3, 2014. He remained on interim bail from July 11, 2014 till September 22, 2015.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has not misused the liberty as such he can be granted the concession of bail.

I have considered the contention of learned counsel for the petitioner. The petitioner has already availed the benefit of interim bail

during the period the chemical examiner report was not available. In view of serious allegations of having been found in possession of commercial quantity of Diphenoxylate Hydrochloride, this petition is dismissed. However, it is ordered that in case the prosecution evidence is not concluded within a period of six months after the next date of hearing, the trial Court shall release the petitioner on bail on his furnishing bail bonds/ surety bonds to its satisfaction, on expiry of said period.
