Kuldip Singh, J. (Oral)

Impugned in the present petition is the order dated 9.1.2014, passed by learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Gurdaspur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner had not done matriculation. Therefore, he is unable to produce the matriculation certificate.

The petitioner has already been declared a proclaimed offender by the trial Court. At this stage, there is no ground to quash the FIR. The petitioner is directed to surrender before the trial Court and raise all the pleas before the trial Court at the time of framing of charge.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the

petitioner is living in Norway and wants to surrender before the trial Court. Therefore, he may be protected for one month to enable him to surrender before the trial Court.

In the circumstances, order declaring petitioner as proclaimed offender, is stayed for a period of 30 days from today to enable the petitioner to surrender before the trial Court.

The petition is accordingly disposed of.
