The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeking regular bail in FIR No.27 dated 19.02.2016 registered under Section 379 IPC (Section 379-B IPC added later on) at Police Station City Civil Line Patiala, District Patiala.

Heard learned counsel for the rival parties.

The father of the petitioner is present in the Court with his counsel identified by him.

The prosecution case is that the petitioner had come on a motorcycle and snatched the purse of the complainant containing ₹35,000/-.

The learned State counsel submits that ₹7,000/- have been recovered from the petitioner.

Counsel for the petitioner, on instructions from the father of the petitioner makes the statement that within a week an amount of

₹20,000/- will be deposited with the trial Court and a balance amount of ₹8,000/- would be deposited thereafter within a period of two months. Statement of learned counsel for the petitioner is accepted.

Acting on this statement and looking to the fact that the petitioner is in jail from 01.03.2016 and looking to the fact that he is only aged about 18 years and also the undertaking given by father of the petitioner that he would take care that the petitioner does not involve in any such activity, I am inclined to grant bail to the petitioner. Hence, I make the following order:

ORDER

- (i) The petition is allowed.
- (ii) The petitioner be released on bail to the satisfaction of the CJM/Duty Magistrate, Patiala on deposit of ₹20,000/- within a week from today.
- (iii) The petitioner shall not tamper or influence the prosecution witness(es).
- (iv) In case of violation of the above condition, the present order shall come to an end and the petitioner shall surrender to the judicial custody.
