1. Whether reporters of local newspapers may be allowed to see judgment?

HARI PAL VERMA, J.

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for issuance of a direction to the respondent-State to get the case registered for the offence of murder and other offences and for directing the investigation of the case to be done from CID Crime or some independent investigating agency.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that minor daughter of the petitioner was killed and cremated during night and when brother of the petitioner made a complaint to the police, he was also eliminated on 7.5.2015.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has further contended that on 19.12.2013, brother of the petitioner, namely, Harbilash had gone to Police Station Barwala and informed the police about the murder of Sonia. Though

the police had visited the village, but under the influence of the accused party, went back without conducting any investigation. The petitioner moved representation regarding murder of the minor girl Sonia to the higher police officials for taking action against the accused, but till date, no action has been taken by the police.

Perusal of the paper book reveals that the petitioner has not placed on record any such material which may persuade this Court for any intervention in the case at this stage. The only representation as attached with the petition is addressed to the Chief Minister, Haryana. Thus, this Court, in the absence of any representation made to the concerned authorities, is not inclined to issue any direction to the respondent-State. Further more, no such direction for registration of the case can be issued by resorting the provisions of Section 482 Cr.P.C.

As such, this Court finds no merit in the present petition and the same is, accordingly, dismissed.
