The petitioner seeks the concession of anticipatory bail, in a case registered against him for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 279, 337, 427 IPC, registered at Police Station Division No.8, Ludhiana, on 11.05.2013.

Along with the application he has attached a medical certificate, showing that he was under going medical problems and was last discharged from hospital on 2.2.2014. Thereafter, it is stated that he is still receiving medical treatment.

Even if that is so, it is still not reason enough to not appear before the trial Court, atleast after a reasonable time of his discharge. Consequently, he having been declared to be a proclaimed offender/ proclaimed person due to his non appearance, I see no error in such proclamation.

However, looking at the nature of the offences that he is charged with, if the petitioner surrenders before the trial Court and submits an application seeking regular bail, it shall be decided expeditiously, preferably within a period of 10 days from the filing of the application.
