JASPAL SINGH, J.(ORAL)

1. This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No. 274 dated 13.10.2014, under Sections 452, 323, 506 and 34 of IPC and Sections 25/27/54/59 of Arms Act, registered at Police Station Patti, and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise.

2. Vide order dated April 25, 2016, parties were directed to appear before the learned trial Court, for getting their statements recorded. In compliance thereof, report of trial Court has been received, wherein, it has been categorically observed that the matter has been compromised between the parties voluntarily and without any pressure, threat or coercion.

3. So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in cases reported as *Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab & Anr.* 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and *Narinder Singh*

and Ors. vs. State of Punjab & Anr., (2014) 6 SCC 466, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No.274 dated 13.10.2014, under Sections 452, 323, 506 and 34 of IPC and Sections 25/27/54/59 of Arms Act, registered at Police Station Patti, and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, are quashed qua the petitioners.
