JASPAL SINGH, J.(ORAL)

1. This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No.156 dated 19.06.2010, under Sections 419, 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of IPC registered at Police Station Division No.4, District Jalandhar and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise.

2. Vide order dated April 18, 2016, parties were directed to appear before the learned trial Court, for getting their statements recorded. On 27.04.2016, Sh. Kapil Shoor (attorney of his father Sh. Joginder Pal Shoor who is complainant in this case) and accused persons have made the statement that due to intervention of the respectables of the area, they have arrived at compromise voluntarily and without any pressure from any side. In compliance thereof, report of trial Court has been received, wherein, it has been categorically observed that the matter has been compromised between the parties voluntarily and without any pressure, threat or coercion.

3. So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in cases reported as ***Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab & Anr. 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052*** and ***Narinder Singh and Ors. vs. State of Punjab & Anr., (2014) 6 SCC 466***, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No.156 dated 19.06.2010, under Sections 419, 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of IPC registered at Police Station Division No.4, District Jalandhar, and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, are quashed qua the petitioners.
