JASPAL SINGH, J.(ORAL)

This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No.53 dated 27.03.2016 under Sections 447, 511, 336, 506, 427, 148, 149 and 379-B of Indian Penal Code and Section 25, 27 of Arms Act registered at Police Station Moga City, District Moga (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 19.04.2016 (Annexure P-2) alleged to have been arrived at in between the parties.

2. Report of learned trial Court has been received, wherein, it has been categorically observed that the statements of both the parties are genuine and not the result of any pressure or coercion in any manner. Compromise entered into between the parties is valid. Even otherwise, matter involved in these proceedings is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest. It has also mentioned in the report that petitioner No.5-Nazar Singh has not appeared before the trial Court.

3. In view of above, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the name of petitioner No.5-Nazar Singh may be deleted from the array of parties
4. Ordered accordingly.

So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in cases reported as *Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another*; 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and *Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another (2014) 6 SCC 466*, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.
6. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No.53 dated 27.03.2016 under Sections 447, 511, 336, 506, 427, 148, 149 and 379-B of Indian Penal Code and Section 25, 27 of Arms Act registered at Police Station Moga City, District Moga and all subsequent proceedings arising out of the same are quashed qua petitioners No.1 to 4, 6 and 7.
