JASWANT SINGH, J (ORAL)

Prayer is under Section 438 Cr.PC for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner-Gurdeep Singh in case FIR No.54 dated 24.10.2015 for offences punishable under Section 15 of the NDPS Act registered with Police Station City Ahmedgarh, District Sangrur.

On 24.10.2015, on a secret information, the principal accused Suresh Kumar @ Kamal was arrested driving a 12 Tyres Truck bearing registration No.PB-13-AL-8151 and 105 Kgs. of Poppy Husk was recovered, concealed in some of the loaded boxes carrying apples. The truck is owned by Smt. Krishna Devi, who is mother of the accused driver-Suresh Kumar.

It is contended that after a period of more than 10 days, the

aforesaid Smt. Krishna Devi made an application to the police authorities that it was the present accused-Gurdeep Singh, who is involved in such activities and not his son-Suresh Kumar. It is further contended that the petitioner is not involved in any other criminal case and has been falsely roped in to save the main accused-Suresh Kumar.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to the interim order passed by this court petitioner has joined the investigation and cooperated in the same.

Learned State counsel assisted by ASI Jaspal Chand submits that pursuant to the interim order passed by this court petitioner has joined the investigation and is no longer required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the above, interim protection/pre-arrest bail granted vide order dated 02nd of May, 2016 is made absolute.

Petition stands disposed of.
